To assist in making your visit a safe one we have highlight the most difficult parts of our course where particular care **MUST** be taken at all times.

## **NOTICE TO ALL VISITORS**

1. A public footpath crosses the course from the back of the 11<sup>th</sup> tee to an area midway along the 15<sup>th</sup> hole. When using this path the public cross the 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> holes. Please take extra care when playing these holes and ensure that it is safe to do so. Be aware also that the public do, on occasions wander to other parts of the course. **PLEASE** take extra care and give way before playing a shot.
2. Potentially there are 'blind shots' at several holes. In particular the layout of the 14<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> holes means that it is vital to use the warning bells, which are in place. The use of these bells will indicate to those playing behind that it is safe to proceed.
3. When you play our course you are **NOT** covered by our insurance. We advise all players to have insurance cover not only for theft of equipment but also more importantly for third party liability accident cover.

**All paths and steps are open to the elements and are affected by adverse weather conditions, it is therefore important to use extra vigilance in these areas.**
